

How Much Is The Price of Admission

Romans 8: 32: “He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?”

Have you noticed these days the cost of a movie? Seventeen dollars a ticket! And just imagine if you are the parent of one of those young people who is so crazy about a movie that they want to see it two, three or even four times in a row! You might as well be making an investment in their college education.

Lots of occasions in our culture are “pay as you go . . .” You show up and pay for the privilege of entering into a meal out, a movie, a game of laser tag or a concert. The price of admission is what you pay at the door. This concept is easy to understand and we tend to function off of this assumption of how things work in our busy society.

But, the church is not like the world. I was at the Conference Office this past week and bumped into the former treasurer. With the nearing of a historic snowstorm, he said to me, “Missing a Sunday isn’t helpful for the church budget, is it, Lisa? Especially when people sometimes think of their offering as the price of admission.” And by this he meant, if our giving corresponds to our attendance, then it is a testimony to our own consistency or inconsistency in terms of worship.

But if what we give to God is an offering to the One who creates and saves us, then our giving is to be a declaration not of our own consistency or inconsistency, but to the reliability and constancy of God. Let us try to imitate God, in upholding those in need and giving thanks for the help God has given to us each day of our lives, by faithfully offering to Him, a portion of our blessings.

If we are to do that, then we move from a sporadic pattern of giving when we are here, to giving to God’s Glory whether or not we are in attendance each Sunday, whether or not we are on vacation, whether or not we experience a historic snowstorm. Such giving as this tries to imitate not just the consistency, but, too, the constancy of God.

And here is where the theological lesson of this unexpected analogy becomes clear. What is the greatest place or event or benefit into which you and I will ever seek admission? It’s not Buckingham Palace or the White House or the speech of the finest leader living. No, it is admission into the Kingdom which is eternal, into the fellowship of saints that is unending, and the heaven which Christ gives to us.

And it is ours, we know, not because it is free, but because Christ has paid the cost of our admission. He’s gotten us a ticket. He’s saved us a place. All this is something we could never gain with all the riches we ever might have. It is too costly, and the cost has been paid by Christ, who died on the Cross though he knew no sin, that we who sin might know Glory.

If we understand this, then, our giving is more than a donation we make toward a church budget on the Sunday we attend. It is not admission at all. It is a way of adoring and thanking the Christ who has admitted us into life everlasting. Might what our Lord has done, profoundly affect not just what we give, but the way we give it—and not just gifts we offer in hand, but, too, those from our hearts.

As the New Year begins, and as Lent nears, might we be constant in offering ourselves to God, as God is constant in offering us eternity.

A Time to be Neighborly

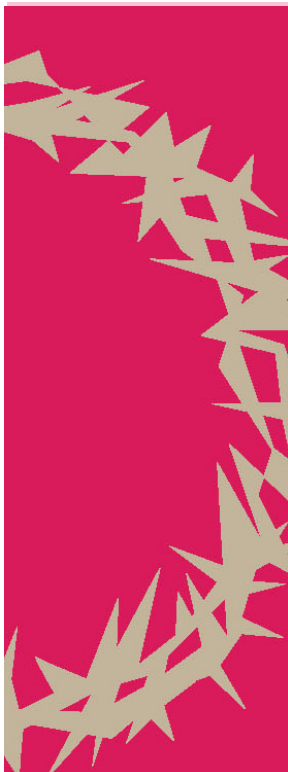

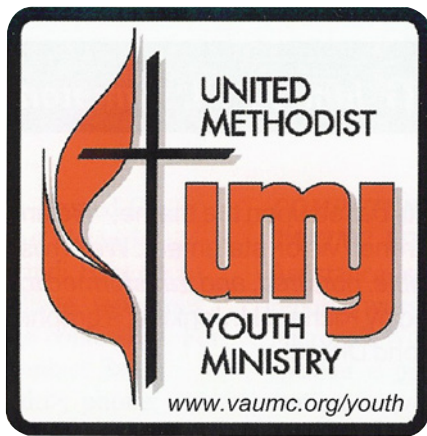
